Biographical Information

Dr Menz is Senior Lecturer in Political Economy at Goldsmiths, University of London. His Ph.D. dissertation from the University of Pittsburgh won the Best Dissertation Award from the European Union Studies Association in 2003. In 2004, he was Visiting Research Fellow at the European Union Center at the University of Pittsburgh and in 2006 served as Jean Monnet Fellow in the Department of Social and Political Studies at the European University Institute in San Domenico di Fiesole, Italy. He is currently in Australia as Visiting Research Fellow at the National Europe Centre, ANU.

Research Interests

Dr Menz's research interests are in International Political Economy, focusing on the dynamics of globalisation and adjustment processes at the national level. His interests include the impact of European integration on EU member states, industrial relations and their changing nature in contemporary Europe, and the politics of migration. He is particularly interested in labour migration and the new paradigm of "managed migration", including the implications of the privatisation of migration management. His research in these areas has attracted funding from the British Academy.
